# Safety & Health Actions on Campus

*Our goal is to create an environment that provides an opportunity for students to return to the traditional school experience, while providing effective safeguards to protect the health and safety of students and staff.*

- Practice safe social distancing to the greatest extent possible
  - Post signage and provide lessons to strongly encourage frequent hand washing and hygiene practices
  - Ensure hand sanitizer is available throughout the campus
  - Increase cleaning protocols throughout each campus, including replacing air filters more frequently
  - Limit group gatherings
  - Strongly encourage face coverings on campus (this may change)
  - Expect symptom screening for all staff and students
  - Ensure any staff or students who exhibit symptoms are not at school or in the workplace
  - Ask for partnerships with families to reinforce expectations and following them during the school day as well as any activities

## Virtual School

Online learning through our nationally-recognized Pasco eSchool, offering flexible scheduling supported by Pasco County teachers, and opportunities for acceleration and enrichment. A semester or year-long enrollment required for the full-time program. [Learn more...](#)

# OPTION 1: TRADITIONAL

## ALL ON CAMPUS VS. TRADITIONAL SHARED

### *What is All On Campus?*

- All 6 classes will be taken on campus in an on-campus classroom
- If a student wants to take a virtual class on campus in the eSchool Lab, that is permissible in this option.
- Bus transportation will be provided for all students who will be on campus all day.

### *What is Traditional Shared?*

- Students can choose how many classes that they take on campus vs. online.
- Students will be able to leave campus during the school day.
- Transportation will not be provided for students to come and go from campus for classes.
- The online learning is **ASYNCHRONUS**.

# OPTION 2: *MySchool* ONLINE

## SYNCHRONOUS LEARNING

### *What Does This Look Like?*

- Based on feedback after our distance learning experience during Quarter 4, this learning model will incorporate many of the features that parents and students valued, such as regular virtual real-time interaction with teachers each day for every class. Parents can rely on teachers to facilitate and guide student learning.
- Students will attend school remotely, **FOLLOWING THE STANDARD SCHOOL SCHEDULE AND BELL TIMES**. Students may take courses through the traditional school model while enrolled in mySchool online. Transportation would be the responsibility of the parent with pick up and drop off at the designated course time. The course will need to be scheduled within the mySchool online schedule which is formatted in a traditional bell schedule.
- Our school district relies on both Zoom and Microsoft TEAMS. Teachers and students will be expected to be familiar with all safety and security features, and to use them. **Students will need to be able to attend the scheduled Zoom time with their other courses.**
- Students will have scheduled times, **SYNCHRONOUS** class meetings, and digital resources and assignments that can be completed at home or at school, if circumstances change during the year.
- This learning model provides families the flexibility to choose an instructional model to meet their needs during these uncertain times, and reflects our District's commitment to providing a high-quality instructional experience, no matter what the setting.
- A device and an internet connection will be necessary. When you select your option you can indicate whether you have a device and whether you have access to the internet. As we did during Distance Learning for the last months of school, the district will provide devices and arrange internet hotspots and hubs when necessary.

# OPTION 2: *MySchool* ONLINE

## SYNCHRONOUS LEARNING

### *What Can I Expect?*

- Students are at home learning and will need access to a device and internet.
- Instruction is provided remotely and students will have access to their teachers during the regular school day hours.
- Secondary students can expect daily face to face connections for every period.
- Attendance will be taken daily in each course during the class period that follows our JWMHS bell schedule.

**While many courses will be available through mySchool Online,  
some courses will only be offered through the Traditional option or through Pasco eSchool.**

# OPTION 3: *Pasco*ESCHOOL

## FULL-TIME ENROLLMENT IN VIRTUAL SCHOOL

### *What Does This Look Like?*

- Our nationally-recognized Pasco eSchool has successfully served thousands of full-time students learning online since 2009. Pasco eSchool offers accredited courses, access to academic advisement and college planning, and opportunities for advanced coursework (including dual enrollment). Graduates earn a standard high school diploma accepted by colleges, universities, and other postsecondary programs.
- This full-time virtual school experience is ideal for students who wish to have more control over their learning path and pace, and for whom a flexible daily schedule is important.
- In this learning model, students often work on assignments during non-traditional hours, and maintain contact with their teacher and classmates using web-based class sessions, email, text messages, and phone calls.
- This is **ASYNCHRONOUS** Learning.
- Pasco eSchool offers courses for students in kindergarten through 12th grade, supported by a team of highly-qualified teachers who offer office hours between 8 AM and 8 PM, Monday through Friday.
- Enrollment requires a semester-long or year-long commitment, as well as an adult who can partner with Pasco eSchool teachers by serving as the learning guide for the student, especially at the elementary school level.

# OPTION 3: *Pasco*ESCHOOL

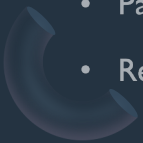
## FULL TIME ENROLLMENT IN VIRTUAL SCHOOL

### *What Does This Mean?*

- A student choosing this option will enroll in Pasco eSchool full-time.
- Students must participate in all required state assessments.
- Students in the virtual model, Pasco eSchool, may attend and participate in extra-curricular and athletic events at their zoned school. Parents would need to provide transportation.
- Students and parents may choose to attend field trips, community-based meetups and face-to-face learning sessions offered by Pasco eSchool teachers to enjoy time with their classmates, too.

### *What is the Difference between Pasco eSchool and FLVS?*

- Pasco eSchool utilizes Pasco County local teachers and has a local principal.
- Response times and approvals are faster and more personalized.

## **ADVANCED PLACEMENT & DUAL ENROLLMENT**

- We will have AP and DE in the Traditional All On Campus and Traditional-Shared Models.
- There will be AP in the Pasco eSchool Model.
- We cannot guarantee DE and AP in the mySchool Online Model at this time. It will depend on the course and numbers who request it.

## **CLUBS & ACTIVITIES**

- We are not completely sure of the logistics of Club Meetings and Activities at this time.
- Health and safety guidelines will be followed.
- Sponsors and Clubs can have options for Zoom or Virtual Meetings as well as in person.

## ATHLETICS



- Health and Safety guidance has been provided to administrators and athletic directors for sports.
- Coaches are required to adhere to all guidance. Students in Traditional and mySchool Online can participate on athletic teams.
- Before and after team meetings, coaching staff will clean furniture, door handles, and other facilities, etc. to reduce health risks.
- Hand Sanitizer should be provided at entrances.
- Encourage schools to use eTickets.
- We are not sure how games will look in terms of spectators.
