J. W. Mitchell High School, a SACS accredited public high school, serves a large suburban and residential area near New Port Richey, Florida. The Trinity community is located in south Pasco County, just north of the Pinellas and Hillsborough county borders. The campus is located thirty miles northwest of Tampa and five miles east of the Gulf of Mexico. Employment opportunities for parents, center on healthcare, small businesses and large retail chains. The location makes it perfect for commuters to the larger cities in our area. There are 30.22% students eligible for free and/or reduced lunch.

THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

J. W. Mitchell High School is an A.P. Capstone Diploma Program School that provides students with a rigorous and relevant curriculum including numerous honors, Advanced Placement, and Dual Enrollment courses. We also have two career academies: The Academy for the Medical Arts and the Business Technology Academy, in which students can earn industry certifications.

- To meet the state graduation requirements, students must earn 24 credits or 18 credits (accelerated) to graduate.
- A passing score on the FSA-ELA is required for graduation. It is taken in 10th grade. A passing score on the Algebra 1 End of Course Exam is also requirement for graduation. % %
- Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment and AICE courses are weighted an additional 1.0 point. Honors courses are weighted an additional .5 points.
- Students are eligible to take high school courses in middle school, and all grades earned in high school courses are used in GPA calculations.
- Our class rank is exact, and students final class rank is determined after the first semester of their senior year.

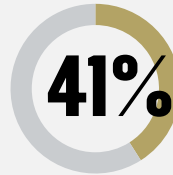

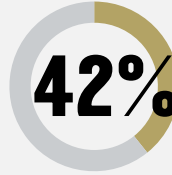

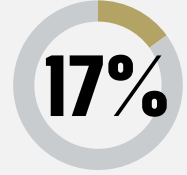
