How do I Register for the Digital School Day SAT?

- 12th graders can register for the in school digital SAT during the testing window on Rycor click SAT School Day icon. (Do not register on your college board account)
- Cost is \$33 and seniors must sign up and pay on RYCOR by February 20, 2024 by 12:00 p.m.
- There are NO fee waivers available for this administration. (Due to the discounted price)
- Once registered, senior students will be notified of test date and time during the testing window.
